

After a few successful outings, the group was fortunate to find Kiernan Cone (Vocals and Guitar) as the band's front person. Kiernan is admired throughout the valley and known for her soaring and daring vocals which are only overshadowed by her stage presence. To round out the troupe the band convinced Jon Hebert (Bass and Vocals) to join the band on bass and to add his brash vocals. Hard Knox despite its short existence has become known and sought after throughout the local music scene. The band has performed all over Western Massachusetts and Connecticut entertaining a wide range of audiences. Hard Knox is widely known for its unique song selection and un-mistakable renditions of those often slightly forgotten favorites. The Bad News Jazz and Blues Orchestra is a 19 piece big band that carries on the excitement of the big band era by performing music of more contemporary artists such as Brian Setzer Big Band, Michael Buble', Big Bad Voodoo Daddy, Squirrel Nut Zippers, Cherry Poppin' Daddies, Bruno Mars, Tower of Power and many others. The **BNJBO** has developed a repertoire that mixes the swing music of the 30s & 40s with the Jump Jive music of today. Audience members at one moment may hear the famous Sing, Sing, Sing drum solo of Gene Krupa, followed by a driving arrangement of Crazy Little Thing Called Love by Queen, Frank Sinatra's New York, New York and then Bruno Mars' Uptown Funk. In existence since 2012, the **BNJBO** performs at various functions in addition to the many concerts they present throughout western and central Massachusetts during the summer months.

# Nature Workshops

# Workshops are free of charge

In a collaborative effort between Stanley Park, Westfield State University, Pioneer Valley Mycological Society, and the Greater Westfield Community, nine Nature Workshops will be conducted in the 229-acre Wildlife Sanctuary at Stanley Park this season. We hope you take advantage of these opportunities to enjoy nature's beauty.

Dave Lovejoy is a professor of Biology at Westfield State University and is the Treasurer of the Springfield Naturalists' Club. He is the Author of "The Vascular Flora of Springfield, Massachusetts" which was published in 2008 by the Springfield Science Museum.

Stephen Svec is a nature nut and has been leading trips for about 30 years. He has led trips, lectured, and birded all over the country, including Alaska. He has an MS in Aquatic Entomology and worked as a Naturalist, Environmental Educator and Field Biologist. Most recently he worked as a High School Biology Teacher in West Springfield, where he taught a Bird Biology Class for 9 years.

Joanne Fortin's interest in nature and birding began when she was a child. She spent summers camping with her family in a pine forest on a lake, an experience she remembers as heavenly. Her parents were avid birders and naturalists, and she considers herself a naturalist, too. Joanne has been an active member of the Allen Bird Club of Springfield for over 10 years and she enjoys sharing her knowledge and enthusiasm with others.

Martha (Marti) Kane grew up in Westfield but spent most of her career in North Carolina training park rangers and managing a nature preserve. She recently retired and moved back to the area. She enjoys doing eBird counts at area parks and monitoring nest boxes for bluebirds and other cavity-nesting songbirds.

The walks and workshops will meet at the main entrance sign to the Frank Stanley Beveridge Memorial Wildlife Sanctuary located across from the recreation field unless otherwise noted. Walks will cancel if there is heavy rain, unless otherwise noted. Wear hiking attire, sturdy boots/shoes, bring water, your field guides, binoculars and camera if you wish.

# May 6, Saturday - "Enjoy the Birds of Spring" with Steve Svec 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

This workshop is for anyone interested in learning more about birds. No previous experience needed. We will focus on finding and identifying birds by sight and sound, while walking through the woodlands of the park. We expect to encounter many species, including Rose-breasted Grosbeak, Baltimore Oriole, and several species of warblers. Bring binoculars if you have them.

# May 14, Sunday - "Looking For Birds in the Woods" with Joanne Fortin 7:30 a.m. - 9:30 a.m.

There is no better time to get out in the field to enjoy birds than an early morning in May. It is the height of spring migration and birds are singing. The natural world is coming alive and spring wildflowers are blossoming. Come and enjoy a walk in the woods! We will spend time identifying birds by sight and sound. We will be looking down to see what spring ephemerals are in bloom. All skill levels are welcome. Bring binoculars if you have them. Rain date will be May 21st.

# June 3, Saturday - "Spring Bird Walk" with Martha Kane 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

Stanley Park is a great place to see a variety of birds especially during the breeding season! Bring your binoculars and help us do an eBird count in the wildlife sanctuary. Beginners welcome; no experience necessary.

# \*June 17, Saturday - "Accessible Bird Walk in the Gardens" with Martha Kane 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

This bird walk is designed for people who love to watch birds but need an accessible path to walk on, or roll their wheelchairs. We will use accessible trails through the gardens to look for birds. Bring binoculars if you have some. \*This workshop will meet at the restrooms near the Woodland Wildflower Garden (park in big parking area near the Carillon Tower).

# June 25-Sunday - "The Mysterious World of Funghi" with the Pioneer Valley Mycological Society 1:00 p.m.-3:00 p.m.

Fungi are all around you, but often you do not even realize it. They play many important ecological roles, including decay of organic material and nutrient recycling and exchange. Come and learn about different groups of fungi and the fundamentals of identifying them by their fruiting bodies, the mushrooms. Part of the fun of looking for wild mushrooms is that you never know what may be popping up! We will walk along some of the park's trails to see what we can discover.

# July 9, Sunday - "Wooded Wetlands" with Dave Lovejoy 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Of the half dozen or so forested wetland plant communities found in southern New England, three are well-represented in the Park. These are the shrub swamp, wooded swamp, and floodplain forest. Although there is overlap among these communities, we will discuss their differences and see the typical species of each.

### August 5, Saturday - "Summer Bird Walk" with Martha Kane 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

Some birds are already beginning to migrate. Let's see what we can find and do an eBird count together. Bring binoculars if you have some. Beginners welcome; no experience necessary.

# August 27, Sunday - "Native Shrubs" with Dave Lovejoy 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.

A complete count of the native shrubs in this region could include more than 50 species and would vary depending on whether or not woody climbing species like grapes are included as well as species that could be "large shrubs" or "small trees". However, a much smaller number are common and can be easily seen in the Park so we will focus our attention on these.

### October 14, Saturday - "Fall Bird Walk" with Martha Kane 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

The summer birds have left and migrants from further north are moving in for the winter. Join us for a leisurely walk to look for birds and contribute to an eBird count. Bring binoculars if you have some. Beginners welcome; no experience necessary.
